

NEWS OF NOTE

ORGANIZATIONAL CHANGES:

TRIP REPORTS

TERLINGUA SINKHOLE, Terlingua, Tx., Oct. 20,1985.

After a long weekend of hiking and four-wheeling in Big Bend (the planned rafting trip was cancelled due to flooding of the Rio Grande), we decided to stop in Terlingua on the way back to Midland and drop the Terlingua Sinkhole. Although Bill had only been to the cave once several years back, he was able to find the location easily, and we all geared up for the drop.

The sinkhole itself is a blind, vertical hole approximately 130 feet deep. The area in which it occurs is not particularly 'cavey', and this makes the sink even more impressive. The contrast in vegetation between the surface and the bottom of the sink is also interesting, inasmuch as the surface is marked by sparse, desert-type vegetation while the sink is full of lush, broadleaf plants- it was like rappelling into a jungle!

The drop was rigged with a 300 foot rope from two bomb-proof pipe anchors set into the surface rock. Susie entered first (this was the first time she had rappelled using a rack, though you never would have known it watching her) followed by Bill, Tony and then Terry. We all wandered around for 30 minutes or so and then started out. No problems of any kind were encountered during the ascents.

This was Susie's second trip with the PBSS, so she is well on her way to becoming an 'old timer'. Its good to have a new person join the group, especially another confirmed lunatic-er- caver (she hasn't caved with Greenlee yet, though, and she may change her mind about us when she sees what we're like when Wild Bill joins in...).

HICKS (WIND) CAVE, Eddy Co., N.M., Nov.16, 1985.

I arrived at the Stevens Motel in Carlsbad at about 6 PM (I was with a field trip group looking at ancient carbonates) and found everyone waiting in my room, ready to go caving. Don and Bill B. had been in Hicks earlier that day to pay a visit to Mud City', but were ready to go again for a deep trip.

Once in the cave, we split up into two groups, with Don, Bill B. and me making our way to the Aragonite Forest while Bill G. was giving Fritzi the nickel tour of Mud City. Fritzi must have enjoyed Mud City, because the two of them ended up staying there for the duration of the trip! Meanwhile, our group found Blood River with no trouble, but never could locate the entrance to the vertizontal leading to the Aragonite Forest- maybe next time.

We exited the cave to a magnificent, starry sky, a perfect end to a good cave trip. This had been one of those trips for all of us that, although it had not been terribly intense, felt particularly good. Don received an Honorary Spylunk certificate for his efforts.

MISCELLANEOUS

TIPS FOR CARBIDE CAVERS:

If you have ever had problems cleaning the sooty deposits off of the reflector of your light (especially if you use a plated reflector, which can't stand up to abrasive cleaners), try using Lime-Away or a similar product. Unlike previous methods I've tried, e.g. prolonged soaking in vinegar, the Lime-Away proved to be virtually instantaneous in effect and not nearly as noxious.
