Chuck found this information for you old timers, who still use carbide lights. Are you tired of the constant drip, drip, drip of your Premier carbide lamp? You know, the water leaks out and around the filler cap, down your helmet, into your face and causes a clean spot. Now there is a solution that is politically correct, environmentally friendly, and cholesterol free. Use a thin piece of plastic, like a candy wrapper, and put a small hole in it. Place the plastic over the filler hole and close the cap. The plastic with the hole in it acts as an additional check valve and prevents the lamp from leaking. You don't own a Premier carbide lamp? Well get one, Chuck says it works great.


