MEETING NOTICE

Date: Saturday, March 13

Location: Meet at 10:00 AM in Rick Day's front yard in Andrews. Rick lives at 114 N.W. Avenue F #B. He is the owner and landlord for a multi-unit dwelling at that address, and would appreciate it if you wouldn't destroy his tenant's property or leave anything disgusting on their lawn. Rick's house is easy to find. If you're coming from Midland, you may come in on 176, in which case you'll make a right on 385. If you're coming from Odessa north up 385, you'll go through Hwy. 176, which is the main east-west road through town, and as you continue north you'll note the streets are numbered A, B, C, etc. Make a left on F, and go until it ends where it runs into the Andrews Middle School. Rick's house will be on your right at the end of the road. If you're late, look across the street at the Middle School where all our cars are likely to be parked, and come into the gym near the cars. If you're really late and no one's at the gym, come by Buddy's at 106 E. Broadway (actually on Hwy. 176 just east of 385), where we plan to enjoy world famous steak fingers for lunch. If you become lost, which would be awfully hard to do, just ask where the Middle School is.

Bring your ascending and descending gear and helmets as we plan to devote the morning and perhaps part of the afternoon to practice. Thanks to Noel and Rick for organizing this.

MARCH TRIP

Spider Cave, a horizontal cave in Carlsbad Caverns National Park, is scheduled for Saturday, March 20th and Sunday, March 21st. By National Park Service stipulations, the group size is limited to 10; trip must be led by a Ranger; and there is a \$10 per person fee to be paid at the information desk at the Visitor Center. Age limits are 18 or older, or 13 to 18 with written permission from parents. Under 13 requires written permission from parents and permission from the park superintendent in advance. Bill will need written parental permission for cavers 13 to 18 when he submits the request for the permit to the Park Service, and he strongly recommends that we don't bring along anyone under the age of 13. The Saturday trip to Spider is full. There are slots still left on the Sunday trip. If you're interested, call Walter at 367-8253. I assume everyone will meet at the visitor center, but don't know what time. If you miss the meeting and plan on arriving on Saturday morning or Sunday morning, call Walter for the time.

Walter has scheduled Chimney Cave, a vertical cave in Carlsbad Caverns National Park, for Sunday, March 21. Although the permit is full at present, it's likely some people will back out, so stay in touch with Walter if you want to go. The Chimney Cave expedition will meet at the Visitor's Center at Carlsbad Caverns National Park at 9:30 AM Texas Standard Time on Sunday Morning.

For both Spider and Chimney, we will camp at the Parks Ranch Caving Area (map enclosed). The Outing Club is likely to be at Parks Ranch that weekend as well; but, as explained before, they are not like the San Franciso Outing Club, so don't let their presence worry you.

A work trip for Amazing Maze Cave, sponsored by our grotto, is scheduled for Saturday, March 27. There are likely to be a lot of people from out of the area present. Walter notes this is a good kid cave. Groundfires and pets are not allowed.

Take the number 285 exit (McKenzie Road) off Interstate 10 exactly 26 miles east of Fort Stockton, or about 11 miles west of Bakersfield. The St. Genevieve Winery, which covers acres, is on the south side of Interstate 10 at the exit. Get on the north service road and go west. You may need to "Y" off to the right of the service road to get closer to the fence line. You'll take a right and go north through a metal gate that's about 200 yards west of the overpass. After going through the gate travel on the road perpendicular to the fence line about 1000 feet. Then you'll see another road heading off to the right; take

that road, and go about 500 feet down into a caliche pit. Camp there if you come up on Friday night. Please call Gralin (682-1904) or Walter (367-8253) if you plan to make this trip.

APRIL TRIP

Bill has scheduled H. T. Myers Cave, a vertical cave near Del Rio that involves 6 drops, for April 17. Tentatively, camping will be at Paint Creek Marina on Amisted. The cave floods when it rains, so the trip will be cancelled if it looks like rain. If you're interested in going, please call Steve at 683-3305.

MAY TRIP

09 Well has tentatively been scheduled for May 15. This is one spectacular cave, and difficult to get into. It requires a wet suit, which you can rent, and you may need to switch ropes during descent and ascent. Call Walter soon if you want to go, as this once-in-a-lifetime opportunity is going to fill up fast.

"Reward Trip or how to get Gassed in a Cave"

We left the CRF research cabins around 6:45PM Texas Standard Time and started our walk into the greatest of all caves in the world or better known as Carlsbad Caverns. Our band of intrepid souls included our fearless leader and answerer of the great question "Are we there yet?" Kevin Glover, also Don Carlton who was almost overcome by deadly noxitious fumes of the gastrointestinal type. Then there was

Ken Kamon whos tall skinny self slithered through the tight cracks and passages, Terry Cargile, Larry Gray and myself Bill Bentley. We entered by way of the natural entrance and as we got closer to the heavily barred gate we discussed the fatal and near fatal attempts to bypass the gate by attempting the ledge of death crawl which is thousands of feet above the trail below. We did the old over and under routine even some in and out of the crawls and spaces that would lead us to our final destination, a place of almost mystical attraction that had been and would be discussed many times along our route. Even though I had been along this route before to a place called "The Hall of the White Giants" I had forgotten how far and how rough it actually was, or maybe I was younger in those days. It wasn't that bad and somehow we all managed to


survive this perilous journey.


