MAY TRIPS

Don has reserved Sentinel Cave for Saturday, May 30. Entering the cave requires a short rappel. Getting to the bottom involves a traverse and a 250 foot drop. However, most of the cave can be seen without doing the traverse or the longer drop. Call Don to reserve a place and for more information regarding the Sentinel Cave. Also, the Memorial Day Regional (Southwest Region) will be held at the abandoned ghost town of Hermosa on May 23-25. Quoting from the SWR flyer, "The main purpose of holding the regional here is to explore and map Palomas Creek Cave for the Forest Service. The cave has some paleontological significance and a preliminary exploration shows well over a thousand feet of passage, with numerous leads. The cave is similar to other Black Range caves with some walking passage and some crawling, mud in the back parts, nice formations, some chimneying. There are several other cave prospects in the immediate area making ridgewalking another worthwhile activity. Hermosa is located southwest of Winston, NM, about 22 miles on Forest Road 157. Most of the road from Winston is good, but there are numerous stream crossings. A high clearance vehicle is advised. Winston is located about 38 miles west of I-25, accessible from the Cuchillo Exit. We think you will find the area fascinating. Several old buildings are still standing in the old mining camp of Hermosa. Palomas Creek flows through the area and should have water in it during Memorial Day. There is a very nice waterfall about 1.5 miles downstream! The elevation is about 6000 feet and the area is well forested."

There's a strong possibility there will be a one or two day work trip to W!@#\$\$% ^ cave some weekend in May. Wildman Noel Pando recently enlarged the opening to this cave, and Ace Surveyor Galin Coffin plans to write a trip report once we've done some more work. If you miss the meeting, call Chuck, J. JUNE TRIP

J. D. has reserved Ogle Cave for Saturday, June 13. Ogle requires a strenuous hike and about a 150 foot drop, and is one of the most interesting caves in the Guadalupe. Steve has a lead on a cave near Cloudcroft that he plans to check out sometime in the coming weeks. Contact him for more details.

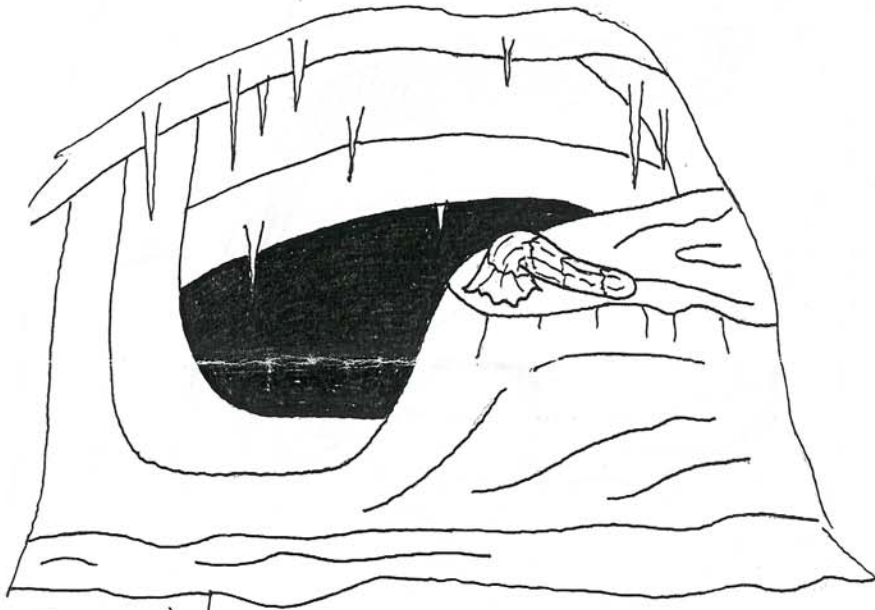
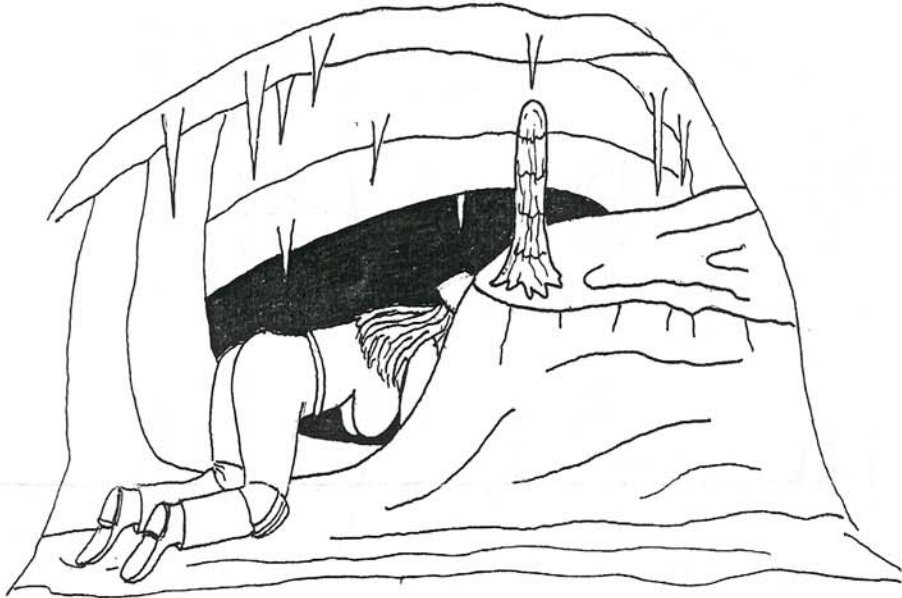
How about those PBSS T-Shirts and scarfs? I saw one for the first time last weekend and was very impressed by the design and color.

NOT-SO-OBSCENE LIMERICKS , by Bill Bentley

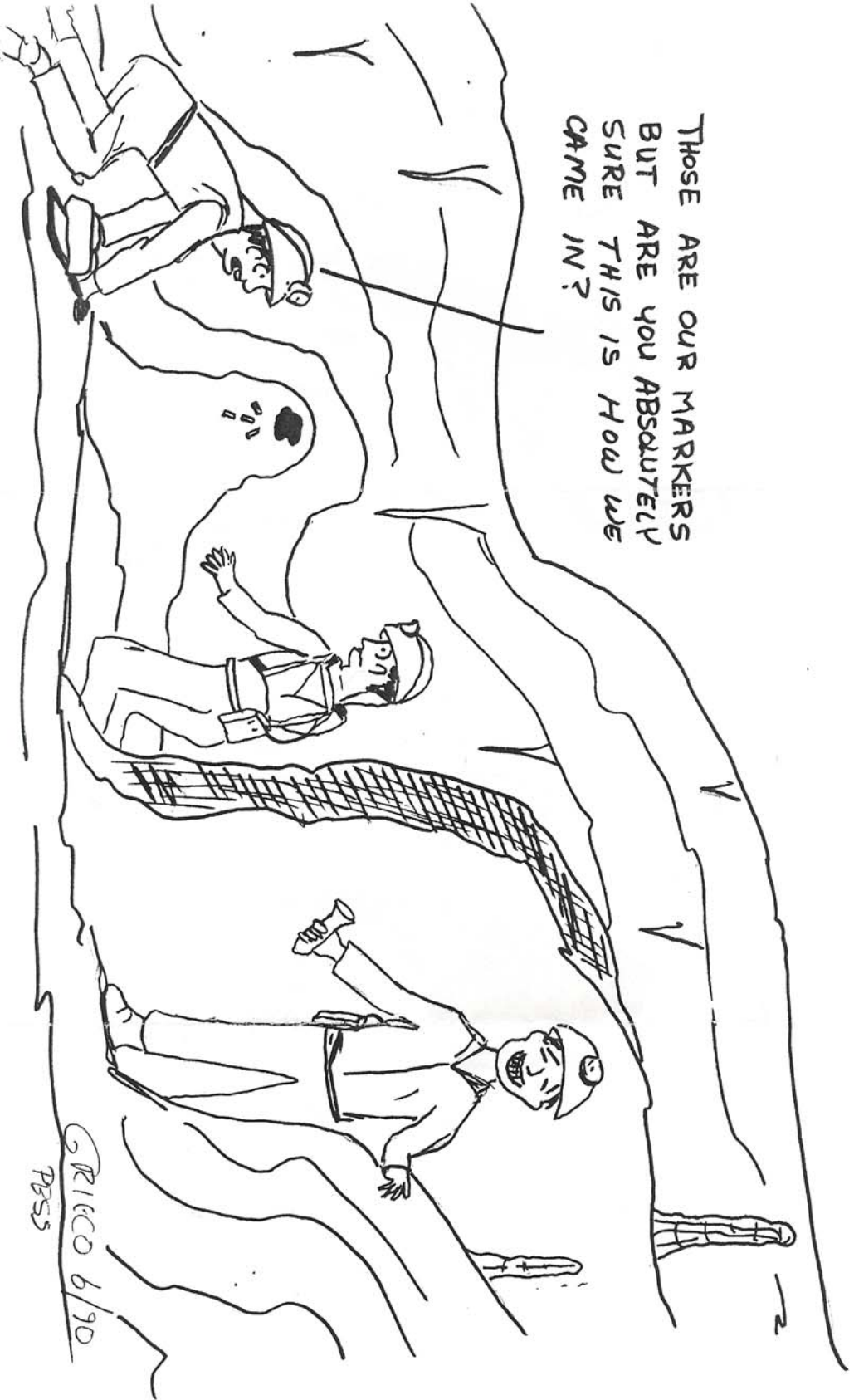
*If its questions you ask of me
