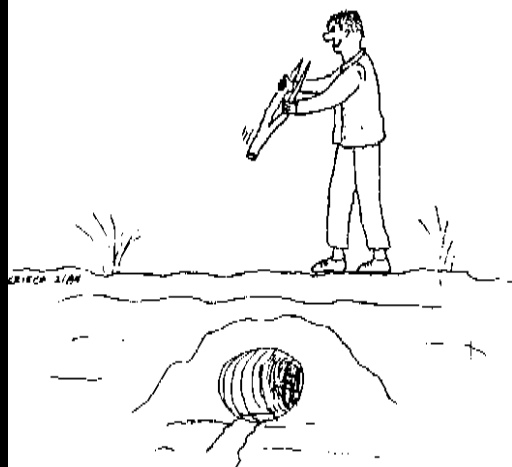


Other Club Trips:

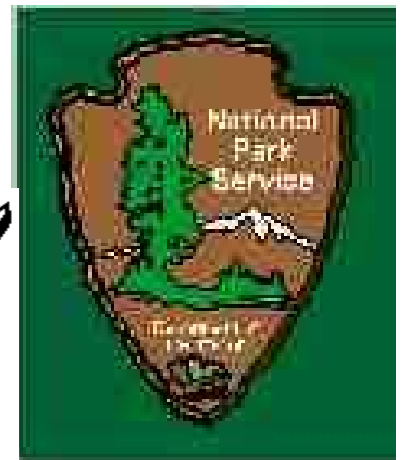
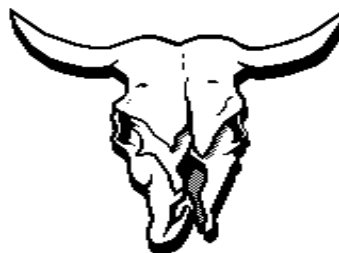
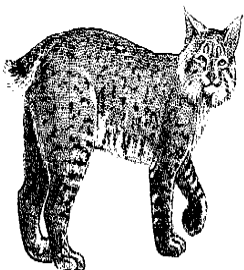
CRF REPORTS: by Bill Bentley

The April Trip to The Guadalupe Mountains National Park by the Cave Research Foundation was attended by Bill Bentley, Expedition Leader Tony (Guad Slut) Grieco and National Park Volunteer Joe Sewell. We had enough trips for all of the 8 volunteers who neglected to show up and have probably signed the death certificate for the CRF in the GUMO area. We picked the strongest lead and went for it. It was located along the trail in the high country near the Blue Ridge Trail and really sounded most promising. After securing a rope from the NPS and getting directions we linked up with Joe and all started out about 9:00 AM Saturday morning. The weather looked good and gave no hint of what was to come. The hike up the trails was grueling and tortuous and was a true testament to the fact that Tony and myself was out of shape.

After arriving at the cave sight around 2:00 PM it only took about 2 minutes to find out that it wasn't a cave by the NPS standards. We drew a sketch map and took a GPS reading for the Park and then started back as it looked like a shower was possible later on. The Cave dropped about 12 feet from the bottom of a small sink about 5 feet deep, 3 to 4 feet wide and 6 feet long. the climb down was easy and at first it was thought it was going to be blind pit. The main room was small and only about 4 feet wide. Then Tony noticed a crawl way at the bottom that was 2 feet high and it only went in about 8 feet and stopped. This was a big disappointment for us so we started back and calculated that there was only a hour of extra daylight to spare if we kept up the same pace as the trip in. About 5 minutes of our journey back it started to sprinkle and within the next hour we had several small rains mixed with small hail that stung when it hit your ears. I know the dangers of being ill prepared and fully know the dangers of hypothermia. I plead the stupidity clause as I have no other excuse. My rain parka was back in my truck and did me no good. We all got soaked to the bone. Tony had a extra parka that he gave to Joe and I took the space blanket that ripped to shreds when we opened it.

The only thing we could do was keep moving, because if we stopped it could have been fatal. Joe had the keys to a cabin that had coffee and food and supplies and best of all a dry place, but it was a good 2 miles of trail in front of us. Our immediate plan was to keep moving and try to stay dry. The trees at first offered some protection but soon they were soaked and were just as wet as being out in the open. The temperature was in the high 40's or low 50's. The great "GOD" of the Guadalupe saw fit to keep the wind from blowing and if it had, I wouldn't be here writing this. Along the trail between Tejas and Pinetop campgrounds it came a downpour and there was no place to escape the rain. Now not only was the cold and wet a problem, but lightening was hitting closer and closer. The closest strike hit a tree about 100 yards ahead of us and the roar and clap of the thunder caused us all to jump. We still continued on and when we got to the turn off to the cabin it was only sprinkling so we decide to go on down and try to make it on to the vehicles before dark. I know that I was suffering from the early stages of hypothermia and I somehow at the time thought it was hilarious to be in this predicament. I took a class on hypothermia during a search and rescue school back in 1987 and the instructor said that you should always carry a large trash bag in your back pocket to use for an emergency parka. I wish I had done so. At 8:00 PM we made it back to the vehicles and headed back to the Ship on the Desert

cabins where Tony made hot lemonade and I consumed great quantities of food. The hot shower I took really felt great. We slept like a rock through the night. Outside the Guadalupe winds were blowing and blowing.....

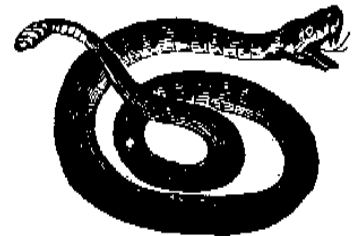
