


## The P.B.S.S. Monthly Spylunk





After a quick hike to Guadalupe Peak on Saturday, and surviving a flash thunderstorm later that afternoon, I made camp at the Carlsbad KOA and rested for the trip. Sunday morning I accidently ran into Bill and Terry at the restaurant and we had breakfast -

At the Caverns we all had coffee and finally took off toward Chimney Cave around 10 AM, after an argument on the proper technique of rigging Deep Cave (Never put two old timers like Ron and Dave within arguing distance without being prepared to hear some good old time cave talk).

After being given the tour of all the lechiguillas on the wrong ridge, we finally reached the lower and lesser known entrance to Chimney Cave. Bill was the first to enter and he checked for snakes. I entered second and found that, once inside, you had to scale down an 8 foot slope and then jump 2 feet to the floor, but it was simpler to climb to one side using numerous footholds (Cavers never do anything easy). Once I was inside, everyone else followed and Dave managed to shower us with pebbles. Ron was the last to enter, probably because he was the trip leader!

Once down the talus pile in the entry room we rigged the rope around a natural bridge and began the long 35 foot rappel. It took about an hour for everyone to descend. Photography slowed the trip somewhat, but some good pictures were taken. The floor of the main room was flat and covered with soft sand, and looking around I realized that once again the Guads had revealed another pristine cave untouched by vandals. The ceiling was very high and in size the room resembled a huge auditorium.

We took a quick look at all the pretties as well as the remains of an old WW II copper antenna array that had fallen down with the passage of time (they discovered that they couldn't transmit through solid rock). We exited the cave without incident. A good time was had by all.

July 21, 1984: Carol Belski, Terry Bolger and Bill Greenlee invaded Mudgetts Cave for a quick tour. Bill commented that it was prettier than he'd been led to believe, and that we should keep it in mind for future novice trips. Everyone had a good time.


