Trip Reports:

DAMN CAVE

Date: 5-17-98

Cavers: Kevin Glover, Tom Kaler, Rebecca Lee, and Mike Snellson Time in Cave: 20 minutes.

The entrance is a large crack or gash in the rock about 6 feet wide and about 14 feet high, a large tree grows out of the entrance. The cave was discovered in the early 1960's and was named by Ken Harrington who accidentally fell down into the mouth of the cave. A large gate is located about 50 feet inside.

Damn Cave is only about 200 feet long, consisting of a large casy walking passageway. It is nicely decorated with large rimstone dams (one is 16 inches high), "lumpy" cave pearls (one is as large as a tennis ball), draperies (one is called "the Ear" because of its resemblance to that part of the anatomy), flowstone, and the usual stalactites and stalagmites. One particularly unusual formation looked exactly like an upside down flower, with a soda straw being the "stem" and a radiating cluster of helicities at the bottom comprising the "flower". The whole formation is about 18 inches long. Epsomite crystals were also found toward the back of the cave.

7/18 - 7/19, 1998

NEEDLESS TO SAY WE ATE DAMN GOOD THIS WEEKEND. ANY WAY WE COOKED AND DRANK THE USUAL COUPLE OF BEERS WAITING ON THE REST OF THE CREW. BARRY SHOWED UP AT ABOUT 7:00 HAVING TO BACK TO FIND LORI, BOTH OF WHICH GOT A LITTLE CONFUSED WITH THE DIRECTIONS. RUEL AND JUDI SHOWED UP AT 9:00, SO WE CELEBRATED WITH ANOTHER BEER AND CALLED IT A NIGHT.

WE WERE ALL BACK AT CAMP BY ABOUT 4:00 AND WERE VISITED BY BILL? THE GUY WHO HEADS UP THE SONORA CAVERNS CLEANUP EVERY YEAR. RUEL AND JUDI CUT THEIR TRIP SHORT TO GO BACK TO WORK AND EVERY BODY ELSE ATE, DRANK, AND RELAXED THE REST OF THE DAY.

WE LEFT THE FOREST AT 1:30 SUNDAY AFTERNOON KNOWING WE WOULD RETURN VERY SOON. I WOULD LIKE TO THANK EVERY ONE WHO SHOWED UP THIS WEEKEND AND ENCOURAGE OTHERS TO SHOW UP AT OUR NEXT FUNCTION.
