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Spring Guads Trip Report 3/8/99 to 3/11/99

Gary Mahan and Melynn Conway left Wichita Falls, Texas on 3/8/99 at approximately 9:30 a.m. (because Gary was late) to travel to 3 mile hill. We were going to meet Tom and Rebecca Lee Kaler, as well as Kerry Lowery (from Big Spring) upon the hill. Gary and Melynn loaded up the Tajamapop and began our trip. We were delayed outside of Munday, Texas, because the camper had a blowout. After changing the tire and repairing the spare, we continued our trip. DEEP CAVE

The following morning, we woke up at 7:30 a.m. (Texas time, or in other words, real time) and prepared for our trip to Deep. After a 45 minute drive (4 wheel drive road), we arrived at the parking

area. After a short hike to the Cave, we found it. Kerry was ready to go and anxious to rig the cave, but it took longer for some people to be ready. Eventually, the rope was rigged for the drop, but a delay from a kinky rope led to Kerry's frustration. He noted on the rappel down that the rope had a knot in it. While on rope, he had to untie the knot, by pulling the 300 ft. rope up and thru the problem area three times. Finally, everyone made it down the rope. We toured the cave as a group on the flagged trail (consciencious cavers that we are). On our tour, we noted stacks of fried eggs, bacon, broom stick totem pools, shields, gigantic columns, and the eerie entrance of the cave in the far distance. We made a loop around the cave. A larger light source would have been helpful to fully appreciate the formations i this cave, due to the enormity of the cave. Before the arduous and tedious task of ascending the rope, we ate lunch at the bottom of the drop. While eating lunch we discussed the fencing wire and wood ladder previously used by fools to descend this drop. RED LAKE CAVE

After a windy night, we broke camp, and headed down the hill to a traditional breakfast at Queen. Following breakfast, we made our way to the little known, Red Lake Cave. After following a confusing map, Tom found the cave. The cave was located right by a fence line under a gnarly, twisted juniper tree, which guarded the entrance. Gary rigged the rope for the 35 ft. to 50 ft. rappel (depending on who was guessing). The beginning of the rappel was a tight crevice that opened into a large room. At the bottom of the drop was another fence wire and wood ladder, originally used by Jim White (first explorer of Carlsbad Caverns). We soon discovered that the cave only consisted of this single chamber. The highlight of this cave was the two large, rare tiger salamanders in the corner of the cave. They were not very happy about the bright lights invading their home. After convincing Rebecca she could not take one home, we toured the room and climbed out of the cave. We de-rigged the cave and went to Sitting Bull Falls We hiked trail #68 to the falls fed spring and then back to the picnic area. Following this trip, we drove towards Carlsbad Caverns, but took a side trip to visit a huge Indian midden, just off the road from Sitting Bull Falls. We ended our day at the home of Tom and Rebecca, where we all enjoyed well earned and needed showers.
